Welcome to Vespers! We are thrilled to share with you this journey and historic production—a convergence of expression that transcends traditional boundaries, inspired by the power of the human voice and movement. Vespers marks a departure from our usual compositions for both push/FOLD and the Portland Symphonic Choir (PSC), weaving a tapestry of movement and sound that delves into a rich and viscous piece of choral music, Sergei Rachmaninoff's All-Night Vigil.

The genesis of *Vespers* lies in a profound collaboration between push/FOLD and the PSC, inspired by a decadelong dream of Samuel Hobbs. This project explores a deep and intricate relationship between movement and sound, bringing out nuances and depths often overlooked in Rachmaninoff's work. Vespers is a brave exploration of untold histories, challenging tradition and preconceptions, and pushing the boundaries of artistic expression for our respective forms.

As we embarked on this unique venture, the rehearsal process has been nothing short of exhilarating. With 100 vocalists and five dancers, this collaboration required meticulous planning and dedication. We are so excited to share it with you!

THE COMPANY

push/FOLD is the vision of multidisciplinary artist and composer-choreographer Samuel Hobbs (Oregon Arts Commission 2023 Performing Arts Fellow). Founded in 2016 as a multi-tiered dance-arts non-profit, push/FOLD is known for its signature style of athletic dance performance coupled with abstract storytelling, immersive moodscapes, and original sound compositions. Described by Oregon ArtsWatch as having a "keen awareness of how humans exist, both behind closed doors and out in the open," push/FOLD's body of work explores deeply rooted sensations of identity, relationships, and the natural world.

Grounded in the somatic movement-partnering method, Visceral Movement Theory™, push/FOLD's training fuses athletics and dance with visceral biomechanics, revolutionizing the expression of power and efficiency in movement. Working with professional artists, athletes, training programs, and schools, push/FOLD's programs and productions package education with performance. The company's mission—to develop community power through arts and movement education, support, and advocacy seeks to address systemic issues around Equity, Access, and Opportunity through education, mentorship, dialogue, and leadership. To further its mission, in 2019, push/FOLD launched the annual Union PDX - Festival of Contemporary Dance, commissioning artists world-wide from any style to teach and perform in Oregon.

push/FOLD collaborates with professional artists and companies (nationally and internationally), offering residencies and workshops to a broad spectrum of entities; recently commissioned by Oregon Ballet Theatre (2020, 2023). push/FOLD made its international debut in 2021 Vancouver, BC and Mexico City, Mexico. push/FOLD's eagerly anticipated European debut is set for Fall 2024.

Portland, Oregon is the home of push/FOLD.









THE CHOIR

The Portland Symphonic Choir has carried out this mission since its founding in 1945: to sing choral masterworks with excellence and passion and to engage, educate, and inspire its members and the community. A central figure in the legacy of choral music in Portland, the Choir achieves excellence in musicianship, celebrates community through music, builds a sustainable musical legacy, and curates an inclusive musical space. With a notable reputation, our 100-person chorus includes musicians, students, retirees, and an assortment of working professionals ignited by their passion for choral music.

Under the dynamic leadership of Artistic Director Dr. Alissa Deeter since 2019, the Portland Symphonic Choir continues this reputation of excellence and dedication by creating powerful and accessible choral experiences for all music enthusiasts. Renowned for electrifying collaborations with major works alongside the Oregon Symphony, Vancouver Symphony, Andrew Bocelli, and Portland Youth Philharmonic, the Choir is pioneering a new wave of interdisciplinary vision with push/FOLD for the world-premiere of *Vespers*.

This spring, PSC also launches our recording initiative for our 80th anniversary year in 2025. Our recordings for this project will elevate and prioritize the work of living composers from our community. Starting in April, our first collaboration will highlight pieces by local composers Judy A. Rose and Drew Swatosh. Judy Rose is a conductor, composer, and educator; she presented our workshop An Introspection of Black Women Composers this past summer and is a long-time friend and collaborator of the Choir and a powerful musical advocate. Drew Swatosh (they/them) is an autistic, femme trans/non-binary composer, vocalist, and engraver based in Vancouver, WA who also sings with the Choir.
